

Dear Friends,

It's already the Fourth Sunday of Lent. I think by now most of us have probably experienced the temptation to relent on our Lenten promises. Just as Jesus was tempted in His desert experience, we can expect the same to happen to us in our Lenten journey, too. If you have, I encourage you to stay the course and keep making every effort to stay true to your promise of prayer, fasting and/or almsgiving. It will be worth it!

For Holy Week we will celebrate the Triduum liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter Sunday at both parishes. We had considered sharing the liturgies between our two parishes for these *Three Days*, having only one liturgy each of these Days for both parishes, but in the end, we decided to have the full celebration of liturgies at both. Please check next week's bulletin for the times of all the liturgies during Holy Week.



Stations of the Cross with **HCA Middle School** Students




