Dear Friends,

November is the month we remember and pray for all those who have died, namely the poor souls in purgatory, and it is also when we celebrate the Saints in heaven. This year we had banners made for our sanctuary that are the patron Saints of the Archdiocese of Saint Louis and of our parish, Annunciation. I had been able to find on-line the stained glass window images of Saint Louis, Saint Vincent de Paul, Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne, and the Blessed Virgin Mary. With the help of the Communications Office of the Archdiocese, I then found a printer who makes banners, sent them the specific measurements needed to fit the framed panels of the back wall, and these 4 Saints came marching in!

For November the Book of the Dead, which includes the written names of those who are our deceased loved ones, will be at the foot of the sanctuary as we keep them in prayer at every Mass. The 4 Saint banners will remain as they are in the sanctuary reminding us how these Saints, along with all of the Saints, stand in heaven as our heros, advocates and intercessors of prayer. Together the Book of the Dead and the Saint banners remind us of our connection and participation in the Communion of Saints with the Eucharist as the Sacrament of Unity.

November is a special time to pray for the Dead as well as to learn more about the lives' of the Saints. As a part of this practice of reading, learning and praying with the Saints I decided for the remaining 3 weeks of November to highlight each week one of the three patrons of the Archdiocese and provide some details about their individual lives. This week it is Saint Louis.

Saint Louis was the ninth King of France under this name. He was only 12 years old when he was named the king of France. The year was 1226, and his father, Louis VIII, had just died. Louis was too young to rule the country on his own, so his mother, Blanche, ruled in his place. She guided her son and taught him well so that he would become a just and courageous king. Louis took over from his mother when he turned 21. The night before he was crowned, he fasted and prayed. He asked God to make him a good servant, to make him a good and holy king for his people.

After the morning Mass, King Louis IX would ride his horse out into the country to see how he could work to make life better for his people. He would often stop in villages to listen to what the people had to say. He checked that wealthy, powerful nobles were not abusing people. When he heard that the nobles unjustly took from people who had less, he forced the nobles to give back what they had taken. He listened to people's ideas for how to improve their country, and he passed laws to protect those who were vulnerable.

The king ordered churches and hospitals built throughout France. In his travels, the king himself would often visit and care for those who were sick. He listened to the needs of others. As a man given the power to guide his country, he could do great good for his people. He worked for peace in the world, and when he did fight, he was merciful to those he captured.

In 1244, King Louis led a Crusade into the Holy Land. As king, Louis could have taken special privileges and comforts. Instead, he chose to share the hardships of his soldiers. Once, the king was captured. While in prison, he prayed the Liturgy of the Hours every day.

When Louis was dying, he prayed, "Lord, I will enter into your house. I will worship in your holy temple, and will give glory to your name." Through his prayer, his support of the Church, and his Christ like service to all, Louis made his whole life an act of worship.

Saint Louis was a father of nine children. A letter he wrote to his son is a reading in the Office of Readings for his Feast day on August 25th. His letter says much about who he was as a King, as a father, and can provide some insight into the mindset of the Saint who is our patron in heaven.

My dearest son, my first instruction is that you should love the Lord your God with all your heart and all your strength. Without this there is no salvation. Keep yourself, my son, from everything that you know displeases God, that is to say, from every mortal sin. You should permit yourself to be tormented by every kind of martyrdom before you would allow yourself to commit a mortal sin.

If the Lord has permitted you to have some trial, bear it willingly and with gratitude, considering that it has happened for your good and that perhaps you well deserved it. If the Lord bestows upon you any kind of prosperity, thank him humbly and see that you become no worse for it, either through vain pride or anything else, because you ought not to oppose God or offend him in the matter of his gifts.

Listen to the divine office with pleasure and devotion. As long as you are in church, be careful not to let your eyes wander and not to speak empty words, but pray to the Lord devoutly, either aloud or with the interior prayer of the heart.

Be kindhearted to the poor, the unfortunate and the afflicted. Give them as much help and consolation as you can. Thank God for all the benefits he has bestowed upon you, that you may be worthy to receive greater. Be just to your subjects, swaying neither to right nor left, but holding the line of justice. Always side with the poor rather than with the rich, until you are certain of the truth. See that all your subjects live in justice and peace, but especially those who have ecclesiastical rank and who belong to religious orders.

Be devout and obedient to our mother the Church of Rome and the Supreme Pontiff as your spiritual father. Work to remove all sin from your land, particularly blasphemies and heresies.

In conclusion, dearest son, I give you every blessing that a loving father can give a son. May the three Persons of the Holy Trinity and all the saints protect you from every evil. And may the Lord give you the grace to do his will so that he may be served and honored through you, that in the next life we may together come to see him, love him and praise him unceasingly. Amen.





QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION

Did you know? Owners at least 70.5 years of age can withdraw money from an IRA account and not include the withdrawal in "Taxable Income" on the tax return. This tax break is available even if the taxpayer takes the standard deduction and doesn't itemize the return. How? By donating the withdrawal to a qualified charity, such as ANNUNCIA-TION. The gift must not exceed \$100,000 and must be paid directly from the IRA to the charity. (Follow the rules by asking your Advisor or IRA custodian to facilitate this for you.). This strategy is ideal for Required Minimum Distributions - use some or all of the "RMD" to make a "QCD". (Work with your tax preparer to report a QCD correctly on your tax return.)


