

Dear Friends,

With today being Palm Sunday we have entered into Holy Week. The unique traditions and liturgical celebrations of this week are to assist us in remembering the original Holy Week of Jesus' suffering, death, and Resurrection As today we remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem with palms in hand, and we recall His Passion and Cross with the Gospel reading, it is the end of the week that is known to us Christians to be the holiest days of the year -- the Sacred Triduum.

The Sacred Triduum will begin Thursday evening and end on Easter Sunday. Triduum means *Three Days*. The actual number of days that have a share in the Triduum, however, is four: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday. These days known as the Triduum, *Three Days*, are determined by measuring a day from sundown, as was the Jewish practice of Jesus' day. So, sundown of Holy Thursday to sundown of Easter Sunday is 3 days.

While there is no official obligation, except for on Easter Sunday, to attend any of the church services during Holy Week, it is important for all of us to consider how to appropriately keep and honor the days of *this Week* as truly holy. I invite you to consider joining in the Triduum services this year that will be celebrated at both parishes. You can find the list of the times of our Holy Week services in this bulletin.








The Pontifical Holy Land Special Collection

Dear Parishioners,

Today we begin **Holy Week**, the most important week in the Church's Year of Grace. In the words of one of Lenten Prefaces, we are participating in the mysteries by which we were re-born, that is, the sacraments which bring into our lives the Death and Resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ. The last three days of this week are called the **Paschal Triduum. Pascha** is the Aramaic word for Passover. **Triduum**

is Latin for "three days." Jesus was crucified at the time of the Jewish Passover; we also understand that Jesus himself "passed over" from this world to his heavenly Father. His death and resurrection gives us eternal life; and we "pass over" to new life when we are baptized. (Romans 6:3-11, the Easter Vigil Epistle reading).

We count the days of the Triduum according to Jewish usage, in which the day begins at sunset on the previous day. The Triduum begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, and concludes with Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday.

At the Jewish Passover meal, the youngest person asks: why is this night different from all other nights? The Triduum celebrations are distinctive. On Holy Thursday, we perform the washing of feet, as Jesus commanded, to signify our love for one another. On Good Friday, we fast, even from the celebration of Mass. This is the most ancient Christian fast, the Church recommends that we continue the fast into Holy Saturday. At our Easter Vigil, the deacon proclaims, This is the night when Christ broke the prison-bars of death and rose victorious from the underworld. We bless fire and light a new Paschal Candle; we bless water, and baptize and confirm our new members. Between the ceremony of the new light, and the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation, we read and pray over the Scriptures: "the reading of the Word of God is a fundamental part of the Easter Vigil." In the fourth century, in Jerusalem, the Vigil included 12 readings and 12 Psalms, followed by the last three chapters of the Gospel (i.e. from the Last Supper to the Resurrection.) These days are different from all other days!

The Triduum preserves some of the oldest rites of the Roman Church. For example, the Good Friday liturgy resembles the Roman Mass in the fourth century: the liturgy began with the Collect (what we used to call the Opening Prayer), continued to the Scripture readings, and included solemn prayers of intercession. In later times, these "Prayers of the Faithful" were only said on Good Friday, until Vatican II restored them to every Mass.

The times of celebration were also restored in 1951; prior to this everything took place in the morning. As we know, the Mass of the Lord's Supper is in the evening; the Liturgy of the Passion "takes place in the afternoon, about three o'clock, unless pastoral reasons suggest a later hour;" and the Easter Vigil cannot begin before sunset. So our parishes will celebrate the Lord's Supper on **Holy Thursday at 7 PM**, and the **Easter Vigil begins at 8 PM** on Saturday. We will have the **Good Friday liturgy at Our Lady of Providence at 3 PM and at Annunciation at 7 PM**, so that everyone can attend at their preferred time. **Annunciation will hold Good Friday Stations of the Cross at 3pm**.

The setting for the liturgy may also reflect ancient customs. The tabernacle is empty; the Missal says that "it is desirable that crosses be removed from the church, or covered." The altar table is stripped after the Mass on Holy Thursday and again on Good Friday. According to historians of the liturgy, the cross was first placed on the altar in the ninth century. The tabernacle as we know it, and its placement on or near the main altar, was mandated by the Council of Trent in the sixteenth century. For us, the bare sanctuary symbolizes the mourning that Jesus foretold "when the Bridegroom is taken away" (Mark 2:20). It also focuses our attention on the Eucharist, and the Holy Cross, when these are solemnly presented to us during the Triduum liturgies.

Years ago a friend remarked: everything we believe is presented in the Triduum. There is no better way to renew our understanding of the kerygma, the essential proclamation of the Christian faith, and to re-awaken our call to be missionary disciples, than our full, active participation in the sacred liturgy of Holy Week.


