

The Importance of Parish School Education (PSR) A message from Ann Kelly, PSR Coordinator

PSR is off to an amazing start!! This is my second year as the PSR Coordinator. I love every minute of sharing our faith with the children and watching them grow in a relationship with Jesus Christ.

I'm often asked, What's PSR all about? To me, PSR is about prayer and community. In the PSR program, children learn about their Catholic faith and pray together in the classroom. Coming together in prayer

Each PSR class begins with a prayer that students say aloud together. Children are invited to reflect on an intention for their prayer, and in many classes children write notes and place them in a prayer jar.

As prayer is central to your faith, a goal of PSR is to help you as parents pass on your Catholic faith to your children. Everyone is on a different point in their faith journey, and learning to pray together as a community is part of that faith formation. One thing we can show our children is the importance of going to Mass to pray together and encounter Jesus in the Eucharist. Mass participation helps them engage and experience how they are part of our Parish family and a bigger world family of Catholics.

As parents, educators, and witnesses in our faith, we want to show children how to give praise and thanks to our God and to value spending time with him.

Student safety

Policies for the program are designed to accommodate parents while still ensuring the safety of our children. Please remember each of the following throughout the year:

Attendance: If you know your child will be absent, please email your child's PSR teacher (and cc Ann Kelly) as soon as possible. We will make calls home to check on all students who are absent without notice.

Sign Out: No child may leave the building without an authorized adult. Students in grades 7 and 8 may sign themselves and their siblings out of the classroom, and then need to be signed out by an adult at the welcome desk. Students in grades 1-6 need a parent or approved pick up person to go to the classroom to sign out the student.

Emergencies: On September 18, all classes will participate in safety drills. Catechists will verbally discuss safety procedures with students prior to that time.

Keeping students safe is a priority while they are in our care, so thank you for all your cooperation and attention to these policies.
