Staying Connected & Family Welcome Night

We are already finishing up our first semester of the PSR year with 80+ students! Although this year has been quite different due to the pandemic, we have learned new ways to stay connected, and we continue to grow together in our relationship with Jesus Christ as a faith community.

We began the year with a Zoom Family Welcome Night in September, where Fr. Mike Esswein and our PSR Coordinator, Ann Kelly, introduced committee members and spoke about the new and engaging online program. Families met with their grade level Catechists on Zoom. Classes continue to meet online monthly to pray together and build community while discussing the weekly online lessons.

PSR in the Home

PSR has implemented an engaging online program this year. It gives parents the opportunity for more involvement in their children's faith formation and education, while keeping safety and flexibility a top priority during the pandemic. As the home is the Domestic Church where children learn how to live their faith, it was important to find tools to help families stay connected and receive support, so they can continue to grow in their Catholic faith during the pandemic. Families are able to progress through the weekly online lessons on their own schedule. They also receive weekly emails with additional resources and family activities. Monthly Zoom meetings are scheduled with Catechists, the PSR Coordinator, and Fr. Mike. Parents are invited to join their children on Zoom as classes pray, reflect on their lessons, and form community with their peers in the virtual classroom. Parents have shared how they appreciate the flexibility and ease of use of the online program, as well as the opportunity to pray with their children more at home.
