Geriatric Assessment

Older adults can be at risk for experiencing multiple medical, social and psychological problems. A geriatric assessment is helpful in determining an individual's needs so resources can be identified. A plan of care is usually developed to promote as much independence, safety and lifestyle satisfaction as possible.

Indicators that are especially appropriate for referrals:

- Functional/Activities of Daily Living impairment (especially in persons over age 70)
- · Caregiver/family stress
- Confusion/memory impairment
- · Depression, loneliness
- · History of frequent falls, marked weakness
- Incontinence
- · Malnutrition or eating problems
- · Noncompliance to health care plan
- Repetitive emergency room visits/hospital admission

Multi-disciplinary evaluations can be done by: Geriatric Social Workers

To aid in family counseling and the identification and referral to available community resources such as home care, respite and transportation.

Geropsychiatrists

Physicians who specialize in the psychological needs of older adults.

Geriatric Medical Specialists

Specialists in unique problems of the elderly including memory loss, incontinence and falling.

Related Health Care & Prevention Professionals

Physical therapists, nutritional and occupational therapists and counselors who offer specific disease support and diagnostic lab tests including x-rays and vision and hearing evaluations.

A Caregiver's Checklist for Planning Ahead

People age 85+ are the fastest growing segment of our population. Well over half of the US adult population either is or expects to be a family caregiver. Planning ahead for the possibility of caregiving, making decisions ahead of time, locating resources and having open discussions with family members can help alleviate potential problems. Listed below are a few things to consider when getting affairs in order before a disaster occurs or medical emergency arises.

General questions

- ✓ Who will be the primary caregiver?
- ✓ How will other family members be involved?
- ✓ Which responsibilities can be shared? How?

Financial and legal questions

- ✓ Do you know the bank accounts, account numbers and types of accounts of your loved one?
- ✓ Do you know what assets your loved one has, their value and locations?
- ✓ Where are deeds and titles to all property?
- ✓ Do you know all insurance information? Company name(s), policy number(s), beneficiary, type of insurance owned?
- ✓ What is the Social Security amount? Is it directly deposited? Where?
- ✓ What are the debts? Mortgages, car payments?
- ✓ Does your loved one have an updated will, a power of attorney, a durable power of attorney? Where are these documents?
- ✓ Has an Advanced Directive been given to the primary physician and relatives who may need it?

Physical condition questions

- ✓ Has your loved one had a recent physical? A geriatric assessment?
- ✓ What medications are being taken? Prescription? Over the counter?

Housing questions

- ✓ Can your loved one live alone?
- ✓ Is senior housing an option?
- What housing options are acceptable to your loved one and family? Is a nursing facility or personal care facility needed? Is your loved one on waiting lists for these facilities if they are (or soon will be) needed?

End of life questions

What are your loved ones wishes for funeral and burial arrangements? Have arrangements already been secured?

National Family Caregiver Support Program (NFCSP)

Funded by the Older American's Act Reauthorization of 2000, the National Family Caregiver Support Program supports caregivers of older adults in their role of providing necessary and vital care. One of the most important highlights of this program is the focus on the **Caregiver**. Traditionally, the older adult is viewed as the consumer of services and the focus of the care planning process.

New attention is also given to grandparents raising grandchildren. In response, national, state and local social service environments have adapted to meet the needs of these caregivers. Recognizing this, the term **Kinship Caregiver** is commonly used when describing the family dynamics of children being raised by relatives. Both **Caregiving** for parents and **Kinship Caregiving** for Grandparents Acting as Parents are discussed here.

Phone Tips for Seniors

- Start a buddy system. You and a friend or relative can set a special time when you call each other every day. It's an easy way to keep track of each other.
- People who live alone, especially women, can list only first and middle initials in the phone directory to avoid calls from people making harassing calls.
- Use answering machines to keep potential burglars guessing about who's home and who's not. Women living alone may ask a male friend or relative to make the recording using your telephone number only.

Stop telephone scams by keeping this in mind:

- Hang up if telemarketers call between 9 P.M.-8 A.M.
- If you suspect a scam, contact the State Attorney General, Consumer Protection Division
- Resist high pressure sales. True businesses will respect the word "no."
- If you tell the seller not to call back and he does, hang up. That's against the law!
- Be sure to get written information before you commit to anything.

When you're out:

- Make sure someone knows where you're going and when you expect to return.
- Carry change for telephone and transportation.
- · Carry a shriek alarm.
- When using a bus or other public transportation, sit as near the driver as possible.

WHAT THE NFCSP OFFERS YOU

The primary goal of the NFCSP is support to the "Family/Unpaid" Caregiver. The NFCSP defines a caregiver as an unpaid family member or friend who is caring for a person over the age of 60 years (caregiver can be any age) or older caring for a child 18 years or younger. The services available through the NFCSP are:

- **1. Information and Assistance**: Provides information and referral for services and agencies to help with the needs and concerns of caregivers.
- **2. Counseling**: Caregivers are eligible for one-on-one counseling to address the issues involved in caregiving.
- 3. Education and Training: A series of workshops, retreats or in-home programs affording caregiver individualized training on subjects of caregiving, such as hands—on skills.
- **4. Respite** (relief) **Services**: Short term service to relieve the caregiver of the duties of caregiving. This may be in the form of adult day care, in-home respite or institutional care.
- **5. Care Coordination and/or Case Management**: Assistance gaining access to services for caregivers.
- **6. Supplemental Services**: Assistance with supplies such as medical equipment, nutritional or incontinent supplies and other items to relieve the caregivers' burden. Programs may vary by regions in the United States.

If you feel out of control, get help from a professional or call a Family Caregiver Support Program for assistance.
